

12. Purchase a parking permit.

All students who park a vehicle, including motorcycles, on Gonzaga property must register it with Campus Public Safety and Security. Parking lots are designated and posted by permit color and are restricted to particular groups (staff/faculty, law students, residence halls, rental units, etc.). Vehicles can be registered at the Security Office in the lower level, east side of Welch Hall or by visiting gonzaga.edu/parking.

Have your vehicle license plate number and Gonzaga ID number available when you register. After completing your registration, print a copy of the receipt and bring it to the Security Office at Welch Hall to pick up your parking permit. Be sure to discuss driver's license and insurance requirements with ISSS once you arrive on campus.

13. Learn about the Campus Public Safety and Security Department.

Gonzaga encourages students to join in the effort to provide a safe and caring environment in which living, learning and working can take place most productively. For more information visit gonzaga.edu/security, call (509) 313-2222 or visit Welch Hall.

14. Check your Zagmail for your assigned Mailbox number.

Undergraduate students living on campus must have a Mailbox (MSC box) in order to receive packages and mail. Mail cannot be delivered to residence halls or apartments. We will automatically assign you a mailbox if you are living on campus and notify you of the number via an email.

Personal belongings can be shipped to your MSC Box ahead of your arrival on campus, starting December 19, 2016.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

1. Check your new Gonzaga email (Zagmail) regularly.

As a Gonzaga student, you have been assigned a username, password and email address that provide you access to technology services, which are referred to as Zagnet. These include the student network in the residence halls, access to email, University computer labs, Blackboard and the automated library systems. In order to access these technology resources you will need to activate your account by creating a new password at gonzaga.edu/passwordreset. Please note you must provide your Visa or Passport number when creating your account.

Gonzaga's student email is hosted by Microsoft and is called Zagmail. Once you activate your account, you can access your email at <https://zagmail.gonzaga.edu>. You will create your own password.

This email address will be used for ALL official communication from the University from now on. Please check it regularly so you don't miss important updates! If you need assistance with this process, please call the IT Help Desk at (509) 313-5550 during the week, or email techsupport@gonzaga.edu.

2. Submit your registration survey or plan registration with your advisor.

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

Watch your Zagmail account for an email from the Office of Academic Advising and Assistance (AAA) regarding registration and enrollment information. Be prepared to provide information including your major or intended area of study, special requests, and details of any applicable transfer or advanced standing credit. Upon receipt, AAA will enroll you for your first semester coursework, and will communicate with you regarding your schedule and faculty advisor assignment. For questions, please contact the office at advise@gonzaga.edu.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Gonzaga's Admission Office will send information regarding course registration and your registration contact to your Zagmail account.

ALL STUDENTS: Please wait to purchase textbooks until your schedule is finalized.

3. Submit your ZagLiving application.

Full-time undergraduate students who are under the age of 21 must reside within the University residential system during their first and second years.

After submitting your ZagLiving application at gonzaga.edu/accepted, the Housing & Residence Life Department will send an email regarding housing.

Please note that your Rental Agreement states dates for arrival. Requesting an arrival date before the one listed in your Rental Agreement will require a request form and, if approved, charges will be applied to your account. Remember an Early Arrival Form needs to be completed in order to move in early for International Student Orientation.

4. Update your emergency contact information.

Visit gonzaga.edu/zagweb. Click on *Enter Secure Area*, and enter your Gonzaga ID (from the front of this document) and six-digit PIN number. Then, click on *Personal Information*. Choose *Update Emergency Contacts*, and update the information as necessary.

5. Submit the New Student Medical Forms by January 3, 2017.

The New Student Medical Forms included in this packet should be completed and sent directly to Health & Counseling. A business reply envelope has been provided, or the documents can be scanned and emailed to studenthealth@gonzaga.edu. All students are required to provide documentation of two measles (rubeola) vaccines. For more information on Health & Counseling Services, please visit gonzaga.edu/healthandcounseling.

6. Plan to arrive in Spokane on Sunday, January 15 or Monday, January 16, 2017.

Check your Zagmail for more information on requesting an airport pickup on one of these days from Gonzaga's International Student & Scholar Services (ISSS) Office. The cost is \$10.00 and payable online. The mandatory International Student Orientation is Tuesday, January 17, beginning at 8 a.m. ALL INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND! 7. Save the date for New Student Orientation: Tuesday, January 17, 2017.

First Year Experience Programs coordinates New Student Orientation, which you can learn more about at gonzaga.edu/orientation. All students are registered for Orientation and we appreciate your RSVP to confirm your attendance by Wednesday, January 11. Keep checking your Zagmail for important information regarding New Student Orientation.

8. Submit final transcripts and AP/IB credit scores before your arrival on campus.

All incoming students must submit a final, official transcript from the institution previously attended. An official transcript is one that is submitted by the issuing institution. Your final transcript must arrive before you arrive on campus in order to ensure your spring enrollment at Gonzaga.

Additionally, if you have taken any college credit, A and AS level exams or AP/IB exams during your high school career, please have all official college transcripts and score reports forwarded as soon as possible.

9. Submit a photo to create your ZAGCARD, your Gonzaga University ID, by January 12, 2017.

Visit gonzaga.edu/zagcard to read about the features of your ZAGCARD, and click on the *Submit Your Photo* link for photo requirements and upload instructions.

10. Set up your payment account with Student Accounts.

Spring semester billing statements will be available to view on CASHNet in December. You will receive notification at your Zagmail address. You can set up another person (such as a parent) as an authorized payer on CASHNet which will give them access to view and/or pay your bills. Payment options are also available in your country's currency. Visit gonzaga.edu/paymentportal for more information.

Families can sign up for one of the flexible payment plans at gonzaga.edu/paymentplans.

11. Learn about dining services options.

All students who reside in the residence halls are required to eat on campus under a board plan. Sodexo Food Service provides a full-service food program to the University. You can learn more at zagdining.com.

Sodexo assists students with many health needs, including special diets when prescribed and approved in writing by a medical doctor or for religious-based dietary restrictions.

Gonzaga offers Bulldog Bucks to enhance your board plan. Students may use this allotment to purchase meals and snacks at any on-campus Sodexo food service location as well as several off-campus businesses. You can learn more about Bulldog Bucks at gonzaga.edu/zagcard.
